SUMMER JOB ANNOUNCEMENT

INSTRUCTOR POSITIONS

ALL SUBJECT AREAS for the UPWARD BOUND SUMMER PROGRAM at UC RIVERSIDE

Deadline to Apply: Open until filed

The Summer Program is a 5-week academic program designed to enrich the skills students need to be well prepared for their next level of classes in a particular subject area (English, Math, Science, etc.). Furthermore, the program enhances their understanding and awareness of study and college survival skills while living on the college campus.

Summer Instructors will provide academic instruction to high **DESCRIPTION** chool Upward Bound participants. Instructors will teach classes Monday through Thursday between the hours of 12:00-2:00pm.

Instructors will teach two hours a day, four days a week, for five weeks. During the five weeks, students will rotate every week. Thus, instructors will have different students every week for each of the five weeks. Class sizes generally range from 18-25 students. Program students will live on UCR's campus and take classes in a university setting.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the supervision of the Upward Bound Director/Assistant Director, the Summer Instructor will develop a curriculum and teach the Upward Bound participants during a five-week summer program. Responsibilities include:

- Provide class instruction and motivation to reduce academic anxiety -Design a course syllabus and produce a weekly lesson plan
- Collaborate with other Summer Instructors and UB Assistant Director to ensure that course material meets UB goals
- Participate in weekly staff meetings
- Evaluate and communicate each student's academic progress to UB Assistant Director & Residential Supervisors on a weekly basis
- Provide final grade reports
- Monitor students' attendance and report any absences/truancies or disruptive behavior to UB Assistant Director & Residential Supervisors.

QUALIFICATIONS

Candidate should possess the qualities to work with students that are economically, socially, and academically disadvantaged backgrounds. The candidates who possess the *following qualifications will be giving hiring preference:*

- Have experience teaching Math to high school students in an educational or residential setting
- Have a BS in Math or related field
- Preferred: Possess a California Teaching Credential
- Preferred: Have experience with or knowledge of Upward Bound or other TRIO programs
