The College is housed in WVU's recently renovated Creative Arts Center. There are approximately 600 majors in the college, 71 full-time faculty and 21 professional staff. As part of its mission, the Division educates students in the traditions and practices of the arts of theatre and dance by challenging them to engage in the many processes used and valued by collaborative artists. To do so, the Division employs 15 full-time and 2 part-time faculty and 3 professional staff, and annually produces 5-7 mainstage and 2-4 lab theatre productions in three theatres supported by well equipped production facilities. The Division is dedicated to providing an exceptional classroom education supported by live production experiences.
