Ammiel Alcalay is poet, translator, critic, scholar and activist; he teaches in the Department of Classical, Middle Eastern & Asian Languages & Cultures at Queens College and is a member of the faculties of American Studies, Comparative Literature, English, and Medieval Studies at the CUNY Graduate Center where is also Deputy Chair of the PhD Program in English. He was the first holder of the Lannan Visiting Chair in Poetics at Georgetown University and has been a visiting professor at Stanford University. His latest book, *Islanders*, a novel, is out from City Lights in 2010. *Scrapmetal: work in progress* came out with Factory School in 2007. *from the warring factions*, a book length poem dedicated to the Bosnian town of Srebrenica, came out in 2002, and is due for a 2<sup>nd</sup> edition in 2010. Along with Anne Waldman and others, he was one of the initiators of the *Poetry Is News Coalition*, and he organized, with Mike Kelleher, the *OlsonNow* project. Most recently, he is the founder and general editor of Lost & Found: The CUNY Poetics Document Initiative (http://centerforthehumanitiesgc.org/lostandfound).
