



Deeply rooted in the African-American experience, yet filled with insights that resonate for anyone seeking to make a better life without disowning the past.

Susan Straight has published six novels, including Highwire Moon, the 2001 Finalist for the National Book Award, and A Million Nightingales, the 2006 Finalist for the LATimes Book Prize. Her new novel, Take One Candle Light a Room, is a companion to Nightingales.
