

Galen Williams Fellowship Program Readings/Workshops Fellow

In honor of its founder, Galen Williams, and in order to nurture the next generation of leaders for the literary field, Poets & Writers has created the Galen Williams Fellowship Program.

Each year, one of our Fellows will work with P&W's **Readings/Workshops** (R/W) program. This paid Fellowship will provide experience in all aspects of program administration as well as the opportunity to interact with scores of writers and community based organizations that present literary programming for diverse populations around the country.

In fiscal year 2012-13, the Readings/Workshops Fellow will be based in P&W's branch office in Los Angeles. Staff in this office administer the Readings/Workshops (West) program, which provides matching fees to writers giving public readings and writing workshops in California, Houston, Seattle, and Tucson, as well as the California Writers Exchange contest.

This position is best suited to a graduate student or an individual who has recently completed a graduate degree; however, other qualified and motivated candidates will also be considered. The Fellow will work twenty hours per week for approximately ten months, providing valuable support as well as fresh insight and creativity to our team. In turn, senior staff at Poets & Writers will provide a comprehensive apprenticeship in literary programming in a non-profit setting. In addition to gaining extensive work experience, the Fellow will:

- Meet weekly with supervisor; in addition to reviewing tasks to be accomplished, the Fellow will be encouraged to reflect upon what he/she is learning and to ask questions about the field and related career opportunities.
- Participate in a series of one-on-one meetings, arranged by P&W, with leaders in the field, to be selected based upon the Fellow's interests. These may include, for example, colleagues at partner organizations or P&W Board members, among others.
- Accompany a staff member on site visits to literary organizations both in and beyond Los Angeles.

Responsibilities include:

- Using a Microsoft Access and/or an online database to enter grant information and **create** confirmation letters and reports.
- Mailing checks and evaluation forms to organizations sponsoring events;
- Researching and conducting outreach to potential sponsors of literary programs in targeted areas of California, Houston, Seattle, and Tucson;
- Assisting with the evaluation of applications for support;
- Compiling data from evaluation forms for reports to funders;
- Executing general office duties as necessary.

Qualifications:

- Strong interest in the non-profit literary arts and arts management;
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office programs including Access, Word, and Excel;

- High-level communication skills;
- Internet proficiency;
- Organized, detail-oriented, and reliable.

The Fellowship is a half-time position for forty weeks. The start date, between mid-July and early September, to be determined based upon Fellow's availability. The salary is \$12,400 for the term of the Fellowship (\$15.50/hour). A modest travel allowance for costs associated with attending site visits and meetings is also provided. P&W will be pleased to cooperate with the Fellow's school to provide credit, if so requested.
