1. Short Film Competition - Call For Entries

Light of Asia Foundation in association with the National Film Corporation of Sri Lanka is delighted to announce the call for entries for the Vesak Short Film Competition 2009, which will take place just prior to the grand Vesak Festival in Sri Lanka during the month of May.

- International Short Film Competition For Independent foreign Film Makers, Film Schools, Universities, Sri Lankans living overseas and members of Buddhist Temples and Organizations abroad (Coordinated by Light of Asia Foundation)
- Mobile Short Film Competition This category is open to any participant from Sri Lanka or abroad

Requirements:

- Films must have a Buddhist theme
- A submission must be between 6 12 minutes in duration
- It may be created in any format (including flash, 3D animation & graphics), but submitted in DVD
- Films may be in black & white or colour
- There is no age limit for entrants
- Submissions under the International Category should be in English, or subtitled in English

Winners and awards:

Films will be judged based on quality of film making, as well as content and message. Films will be judged by an eminent panel of international judges appointed by the National Film Corporation of Sri Lanka.

The best local and foreign short films will be showcased on National Television during the Vesak week, dedicated to the Film Festival. Cash prizes for local winners. Awards and hospitality for international winners.

A series of workshops will also be held during the Vesak Festival week.


These will be conducted by eminent personalities from the local and international film scene. They will focus on Buddhism and Film Making.





