



The Thai Studies Center, Chulalongkorn University, is responsible for conducting the international Master of Arts in Thai Studies. The program is taught in English and is aimed at providing students with integrated knowledge for understanding politics, history, society and culture of these areas. Since 1991, M.A. in Thai Studies has developed professional academics with specialized knowledge and deeper understanding of Thailand, a kind of expertise important to many careers, in which international awareness is required. Through its various methodologies students can come to investigate and re-evaluate Thai values and worldviews in the context of their rapidly changing economies, societies, and cultural lives. They will also be given a unique opportunity to compare different perspectives from the accounts of local and foreign experts.

Non-Degree Program

The Thai Studies center also offers courses to those who are not interested in pursuing a degree program but would like to take some courses of interest to them and to study various aspects of this country beyond what is available in guide books and simple texts. At the end of the semester participants receive a certificate of attendance from the Faculty of Arts, provided that they have attended no less than eighty percent of the classes.

- 1. A minimum of 24 credits of course work, including at least 9 credit hours of required courses and at least 15 credit hours of electives.
- 2. A thesis equivalent to 12 credit hours, together with an oral examination on that thesis.
