



Archaeology Field School in Thailand



Would you like to participate in five weeks of archaeological excavation and scientific analysis in tropical Thailand? This summer (20 June - 18 July 2011), University of Washington Professor Ben Marwick and Silpakorn University Professor Rasmi Shoocongdej (Faculty of Archaeology) will be directing a field school for students interested in acquiring field experience in archaeology. The 2011 field school will be located in the rural and scenic town of Pang-nga.

Together with staff from the the Fine Arts Department of Thailand and the National Science Museum of Thailand you will conduct excavations and analyse artefacts to discover how prehistoric people adapted to the dramatic sea level changes in this region during the last 10,000 years.

Generous support from the Luce Foundation has provided six full scholarships (including travel) for successful applicants who are students at Southeast Asian Universities or currently working as junior professional archaeologists.
