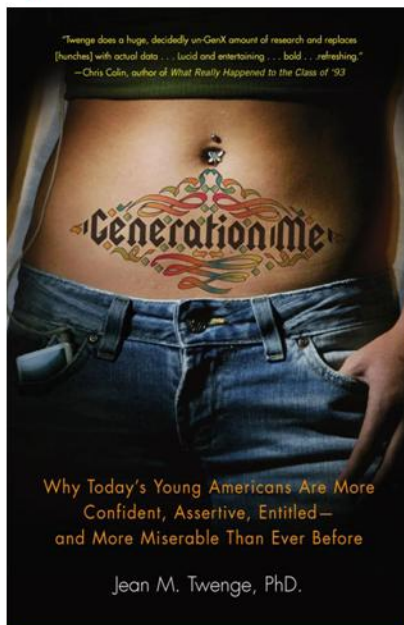


## SCHOLARSHIP OF TEACHING

### "How technology has shaped the psychology of today's college learners"

Dr. Jean Twenge, author of "Generation Me" answers the ever looming question of "What is different about the new generation of students?" Using her dataset on 2 million young people spanning seven decades Dr. Twenge gives a behind-the-scenes look at what drives this generation. Significant changes include increases in self-esteem and narcissism, a rise in entitlement and expectations, and a decline in mental health. These psychological shifts, along with changes in technology, have created a generation of students with strikingly different expectations for their college experience. Dr. Twenge addresses classroom strategies for teaching this generation, also drawing on her experience as a university professor.
