WHO WE ARE

The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), part of the California Environmental Protection Agency, is the lead state agency for the assessment of health risks posed by environmental contaminants.

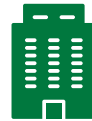
OEHHA's mission is to protect and enhance the health of Californians and our state's environment through scientific evaluations that inform, support and guide regulatory and other actions.

WHAT WE DO

Our key scientific activities include:

- Assessing health risks posed by chemicals of concern and providing guidance for health risk assessments.
- Determining health-protective levels of chemicals, such as public health goals for drinking water contaminants.
- Implementing rapid computational and molecular toxicology approaches to identify toxic chemicals and safer alternatives.
- Developing and refining environmental justice screening tools to identify vulnerable communities affected by environmental pollution.
- Identifying the impacts of climate change on California, and effects of heat and air pollutants on human health.
- Monitoring health of pesticide workers and conducting outreach and trainings on pesticide illnesses.
- Making recommendations regarding fishing safety and closures after marine oil spills.
- Supporting the Biomonitoring California program, which measures levels of chemicals in Californians' bodies.

STEPS TO APPLY

- Go to www.calcareers.ca.gov and create an account, then:
1. **SEARCH FOR OPEN JOBS**— Search by keyword, job title, or state department. Use the advanced search to filter by location, work schedule, and salary.
 2. **GET ON ELIGIBILITY LIST** — To apply for a State job, you need to first be on a civil service hiring list. Follow the directions for the classification you are interested in.
 3. **APPLY** — Fill out the standard state application form and submit it online through your CalCareers account, or mail a hard copy to the address given on the job announcement.



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
