



UC-HBCU Initiative & UC Riverside Engagement

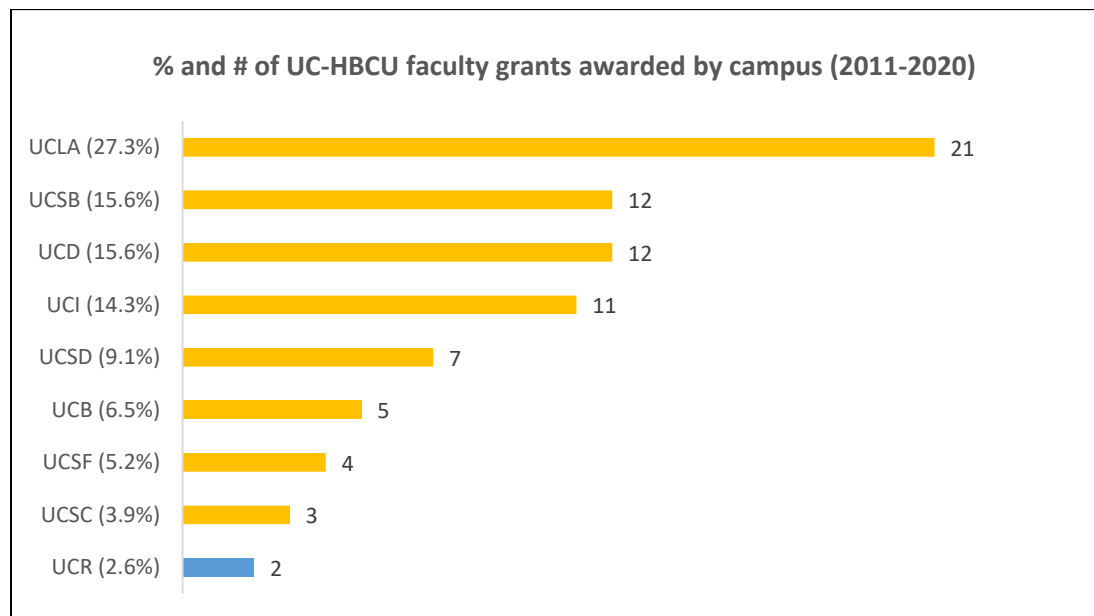
The UC-HBCU Initiative seeks to increase the number of HBCU graduates completing UC PhD programs and support faculty efforts to strengthen UC academic programs and departments by investing in relationships and efforts between UC faculty and Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). Funds are awarded competitively to support student summer research internships and other opportunities that serve the goals of the Initiative. Internship grants are 1-year grants. Pathways grants are 3-year grants.

UC-HBCU Faculty Grants

- From 2011-2020, UC-HBCU has approved funding for 77 grants/projects
- Of those 77 grants, UC Riverside has successfully received funding for **2** of them (2.6%)
- The total approved funding for UC Riverside's grants is **\$348,189**
- Of the 2 grants awarded to UC Riverside, **2 were pathways grants**
- The total number of proposed **student participants** in UC Riverside grants is **15**
- **50%** of UC Riverside grants **are humanities and social sciences**, and **50%** are **STEM**
- UC Riverside HBCU **partner institutions** are **Clafin University, Fort Valley State University, John C. Smith University, Morehouse College, Spelman College**

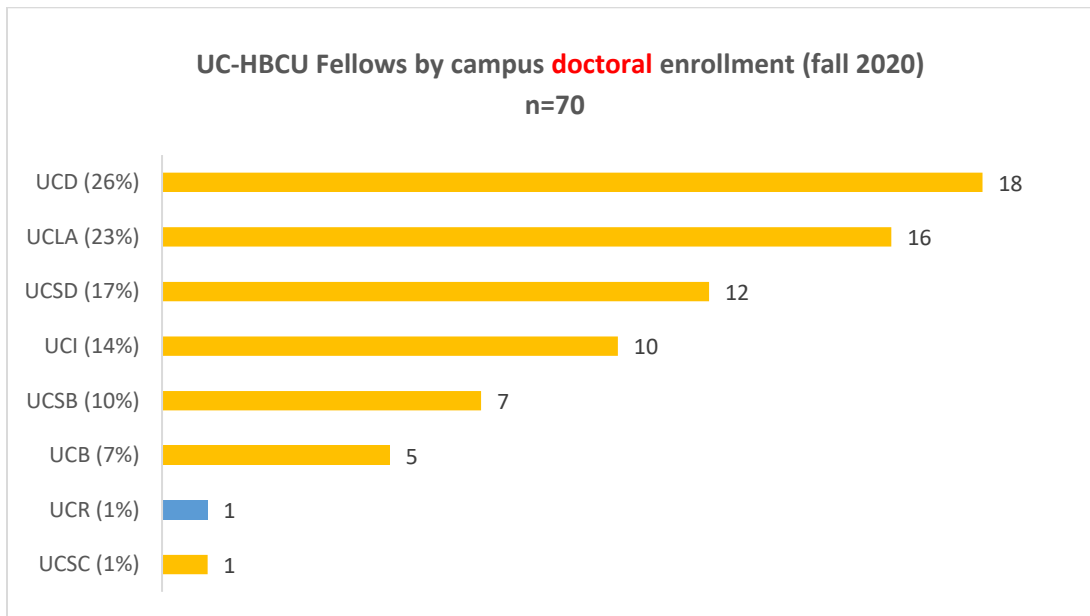
