The University Eastside Community Collaborative (UECC) is an education focused, service organization located at the University of California, Riverside. UECC unites college students of all backgrounds for a year of service to raise the academic achievement level of youth and participate in community service projects in the Eastside of Riverside.

UECC AmeriCorps is looking for self-motivated, committed undergraduates to become UECC AmeriCorps Members who tutor yearlong at local K-6th grade schools and participate in local community service activities. All service sites are within 5 miles of UCR campus; a limited amount of virtual tutoring opportunities are also available. Four unique contract types available:

Tutors set their own schedules quarterly. Service activities primarily occur Monday through Friday, in classrooms between 9am-3pm; and at community centers between 2:00pm-6:00pm.

UECC provides a living stipend to offset the costs of volunteering with UECC. Tutors earn a prestigious Segal AmeriCorps Education Award scholarship upon completing your contract.

San Francisco Mayor London N. Breed announced yesterday the awarding of \$3.75 million to serve San Francisco's Black and African American small business community.

This investment by the Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD) and the San Francisco Human Rights Commission (HRC) is part of the Dream Keeper Initiative, which is reinvesting \$120 million from law enforcement into San Francisco's African American community.
