RIVERSIDE, Calif. – Black Barbershops and Beauty salons within Riverside County are joining the fight against vaccine hesitancy. The Riverside County Black Chamber of Commerce and Riverside University Health System-Public Health have come together with a new initiative, the Trim the Hesitancy Project. The project is focused on making resources and vaccines accessible to Black Barbershops and Beauty salons with the intent of Barbers, Beauticians, and their clients getting vaccinated against COVID-19.

The launch event of the Trim the Hesitancy project will be held from 5:00 pm to 6:30 pm on August 25th at 413 Hair Salon located at 23750 Alessandro Blvd. STE L, Moreno Valley, CA 92553. Stylist may come to enjoy music, food, and education.
