Educationally Joe is a two-time high school dropout that was stuck in 10th grade for 3 years ultimately graduating from home studies. Since returning to school Joe has earned his Associates degree, A Bachelor's degree from CSULA, and a master's degree from CSULB in Student Development in Higher Education where his thesis YOU ARE ABOUT TO WITNESS THE STRENGTH OF STREET KNOWLEDGE set off his research career.
