Water mites: Gateway Drugs to Acarology

Water mites (Parasitengona: Hydrachnidia) are the most species-rich group of arachnids to return to an aquatic lifestyle. They occupy all aquatic habitats from torrential waterfalls to temporary pools, and the ocean. Like their terrestrial relatives, velvet mites and chiggers, water mites have a complex life cycle involving parasitic larvae, predatory nymphs and adults. Their attractive coloration, relatively large size and sprightly activity make the Hydrachnidia one of the most accessible groups for acarologists to study. In this talk, I will discuss interesting aspects of their morphology and behavior, and gaps in our knowledge of their biology.
