"Geospatial distribution of *Culicoides* (Diptera: Ceratopogonidae) in the western United States"

Abstract:

Culicoides (Diptera: Ceratopogonidae) have a global distribution, encompassing all areas except the antarctic. In North America, much of the focus when it comes to characterizing Culicoides species is on pathogen vectors, such as C. sonorensis, C. insignis, and C. variipennis. The current records of Culicoides distribution tend to be focused on species present in the southeastern United States at this time, likely due to higher prevalence of farming cervids such as deer. The current focus of this research is to characterize the species diversity and geographic distribution of Culicoides species present in the western United States. This may help in future research efforts to accurately model distribution changes in both species and disease prevalence as the insects adapt to a changing climate.
