

PROFESSIONAL ADVANCEMENT CAREER TRAINING (PACT) PROGRAM

The Entomological Society of America's (ESA) Professional Advancement Career Training (PACT) program helps graduate students and post-doctoral researchers develop the leadership and soft skills necessary for success in careers outside of academia. The PACT program began in September 2021 and is now in its fourth year. Over the course of six months, participants engage in a variety of learning experiences focused on the fundamental concepts central to success in a range of career sectors, while also gaining exposure to a range of pathways for those with advanced degrees in entomology.

THE PROGRAM

Each month focuses on a different set of thematic skills. The activities include a 360° evaluation, one-to-one mentoring with a professional outside academia, monthly webinars, and monthly facilitated group meetings with other participants to foster discussion on curated reading material and networking among colleagues. Additionally, an in-person networking event is held annually for mentors and mentees attending the ESA Annual Meeting. The registration fee for PACT participants is \$100 each, a modest investment for their professional future and a way to ensure sustained participation.
