The <u>GIS in Higher Education chat</u> on September 3 at 9:00 will focus on the **ArcGIS Web Editor**, which was a topic in this meetup's presentation. The chats in May and in August focused on StoryMaps and GeoAl respectively, which were also topics in this meetup's presentation.

Registration is now open for the <u>FOSS4G NA Conference</u> (Free Open Source Software for GIS, North America), which will be held September 9-11 in St. Louis.

At our **next meetup, on September 17**, Janet will provide an overview of geospatial resources at UCR.

As of July 1, UCR affiliates now have access to <u>Fire Insurance Maps Online</u> through UCR Library. From this platform, users can view and download digital copies of Sanborn maps (city maps with details of each building, going back to the late 1800s) and other detailed historical maps of California. <u>This page</u> of the library guide on maps and GIS contains more information about fire insurance maps.

Presentation

Discussion

Amanda asked whether the UC is required to make publicly shared GIS maps accessible, similar to how accessibility is required in documents and text on UC websites. Janet said she would investigate and report back.

Canserina mentioned that the October Higher Education Chat will be on <u>Experience Builder</u>. In the future, there will be a webinar for researchers who want to integrate R with ArcGIS, and another on using imagery and ArcGIS together.

There will be an open house at Esri on October 17; details will be available next month.
