

The UCR School Psychology Program's BROWN BAG SPEAKER SERIES: *Culturally and Linguistically Responsive Autism Identification*

Bryn Harris, PhD, is an Associate Professor in the School Psychology doctoral program in the School of Education and Human Development at the University of Colorado Denver. Her talk will focus on disparities in Autism identification, particularly by race/ethnicity and socioeconomic indicators, have been documented for decades. Despite the awareness, reduction of these disparities has been limited. This foundational workshop will provide national data pertaining to trends in Autism identification disparities. Participants will gain knowledge pertaining to the potential impact of culture and language on Autism assessment practices, culturally and linguistically responsive Autism identification strategies, and promising practices that lead to earlier and more accurate Autism identification in populations that are historically more likely to not be identified, misidentified, or receive a delayed identification of Autism.
