

Graduate Student Researcher's Job Description

We are looking for a graduate student who would like to be part in our community-based participatory project entitled: "Healing the Academy: Addressing Mental Health Disparities Among Underrepresented Graduate Students." The purpose of this project is to engage underrepresented graduate students (UGS), faculty, and staff to identify structural factors contributing to mental health disparities among UGS.

Under the direction of Dr. Vázquez the graduate student researcher (GSR) will assist in project activities, including documenting monthly meetings; data collection, analysis, and interpretation; and dissemination events. The GSR will also assist with ensuring compliance with IRB requirements. The GSR will be an underrepresented graduate student, including first-generation student, member of an underrepresented minority group, and/or English as second language (ESL) learner.

Desired qualifications:

- Have experience in mixed-methods research projects, particularly qualitative and quantitative data collection and analysis.
- Previous research experience. The GSR will assist during the research design, data collection, data analysis, and data interpretation.
- The GSR will also be involved in manuscript preparation such as literature searches and dissemination of study findings.
- English as a second language.

The position date will begin May 1st, 2021.

Salary:

This is a part-time position that covers eight hours a week (\$21 per hour) for a period of 36 weeks.
