

Students Seeking a Fully Remote Schedule

Students who anticipate facing significant pandemic-related challenges during fall quarter that could be alleviated by having a fully remote schedule should first search the Schedule of Classes for courses that will be offered remotely. Consider substituting a remote course for an in-person course, or delaying enrollment in an in-person course until winter or spring quarter. Consult with an academic advisor for additional guidance, as needed.

If there are no other viable options, then a student may request remote access to an in-person course (also called a “remote option”) by registering for the course and completing this [Remote Option Request Form](#). Student requests will be compiled and shared with departments during the summer. Completing the form does **not** guarantee that a remote option will be offered. However, departments have been asked to make decisions about remote options before second-pass scheduling opens on September 10 and may consider the level of student demand for remote options when making those decisions. Before September 10, students should check the “Final Exam and Schedule Notes” associated with the course in the Schedule of Classes to determine if a remote option has been added.
