DESCRIPTION OF THE SERIES

The virtual series is inspired by the traditions of emancipatory education carried forward by bell hooks and Paulo Freire. Both hooks and Freire recognized that because schooling has served as a tool of colonization, dependent on tactics of dehumanization, an emancipatory education requires courageous acts of empathy and love. Each workshop offers examples of creative, critical tools applied within and beyond the classroom. This series is not intended to be a platform for extraction, but to foster what hooks (1990) called "a community of resistance," through ongoing dialogue and opportunities for participants to see emancipatory education in praxis (p. 149).
