



2022-2023 Scholarship Summary

The School of Education (SOE) is now accepting applications for the following scholarships. Applicants must be current SOE students in the PhD, MA, or MEd programs, excluding General Education MEd and Special Education MEd with credentials and be enrolled Spring 2023 for the award to disburse. The Graduate Advisory Committee will consider applicants' demonstration of scholarship, academic promise, and merit for all awards. Applicants are allowed to apply for more than one scholarship in a single application. Additional selection criteria (if applicable) are listed below.

Note: scholarship recipients will be invited to a scholarship luncheon on April 7, 2023 from 11:30am to 1:30pm on campus to meet with the donor. The Director of Development, Kelly Kraus-Lee, will be in contact with recipients regarding further details.

The minimum cumulative GPA to be eligible for these awards is a **3.500 as of Fall 2022**. PhD applicants are required to submit an essay highlighting their commitment to professional engagement activities, including (but not limited to): conference presentations, peer-reviewed publications, and awards. MA/MEd applicants should describe their commitment to professional engagement activities, while highlighting specific barriers they may have encountered and overcome. Essays should be 1-2 pages double-spaced in APA format and submitted as a PDF. Additional documents may apply depending on the scholarship, as outlined.

 - Female and minority students seeking administrative positions in education are also eligible
 - Must submit research paper or project to support specified interests
