Sean Arayasirikul, Ph.D. Diversity Scholar ATN NIAID New Innovators Recipient



Dr. Arayasirikul, PhD is a medical sociologist whose work is focused on two lines of health equity research: 1) the intersectional investigation of health disparities among sexual and gender minorities of color; and 2) the development of mobile health (mHealth) interventions and methods that employ innovative use of disruptive digital technologies and social media to identify, sample and engage vulnerable populations. Their research examines the impact of intersecting minority - sexual, gender, and racial/ethnic - identities and their corresponding forms of oppression (e.g. misogyny, trans-misogyny, homophobia, transphobia, and racism) on health and illness. Sean has published a qualitative study of trans-misogyny, an intersectional form of sexism that trans women experience and its interlocking microaggressions.
