The RCMI Coordinating Center is launching a Clinical Research Pilot Projects Program to provide funding, on a competitive basis, for hypothesis-driven, **clinical research projects on the science of minority health and health disparities**. Each application must be led by Multiple Principal Investigators from two RCMI grantee institutions.

**Applicant Eligibility:** Post-doctoral fellows, early-career faculty (Assistant Professor), and early-stage investigators from the 22 RCMI U54 Centers.

**Clinical Research:** Human subjects research or research that involves an individual person or a group of people, or research that studies materials from humans, such as their behavior or biological samples.

**Health Disparities Research Focus:** Addiction & Drug Abuse; Cancer; Cardiovascular & Pulmonary Diseases; Digestive & Kidney Diseases; Environmental Health; HIV/AIDS; Infectious & Immunological Diseases; Neurological Disorders & Mental Health; Obesity & Metabolic Syndromes; and Women's Health.

**Mentor(s) and Collaborator(s):** At least one mentor and at least one collaborator from an RCMI or non-RCMI grantee institution are required.

**Application Page Limits:** 1-page Specific Aims; 6-page Research Strategy.

**Awards:** Six or more one-year pilot awards, at \$100,000–\$150,000 each.

**Application Due Date:** January 23, 2023

**Anticipated Award Date:** April 3, 2023
