Application Instructions & Information

GUIDELINES FOR GRADUATE RESEARCH MENTORSHIP PROGRAMS AWARDS (GRMP)

The Graduate Research Mentorship Programs (GRMP) awards are intended to enhance the mentoring of doctoral students during their third, fourth, or fifth years of graduate study. Recipients are eligible for one, two, or three quarters of support to conduct their research (includes summers).

Eligibility Criteria

- Must be a Ph.D. student.
- 2. Must be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States. (AB540 status is okay too.)
- 3. Must enhance the diversity of the department / graduate program.
- 4. Must have completed 2 years of graduate school at UCR by Fall 2020.
- 5. Must be actively engaged in scholarly research leading to the dissertation.
- 6. Must not have more than 7 units of incomplete grades..
- 7. Must be making acceptable progress toward the degree. (For these purposes, acceptable progress for a Ph.D. student means that they have advanced to candidacy within 15 quarters after entry and must complete the degree by the normative time to degree for the particular program plus 1 year at time of degree. Note that students can be awarded a GRMP before advancing to candidacy.)
- 8. Can be on leave to apply, but must be enrolled as a full-time student (12 units) during tenure of fellowship.

Application Procedure

The applicant must follow the graduate program's instructions for deadlines to complete the application form, including the research statement. Two letters of recommendation from faculty are required for each nominated application; one letter must be from the dissertation adviser. Programs will submit final applications from nominees no later than January 31, 2021.

Support Summary

Students NOT advanced to candidacy for the Ph.D., \$5,700 stipend per quarter up to three quarters, plus fees.** Students advanced to candidacy for the Ph.D., \$6,000 stipend per quarter up to three quarters, plus fees**. (**Funding would be for Summer '21, Fall '21, Winter '22, or Spring '22 quarters, with fees applicable FWS only). A Graduate Student Researcher (GSR) appointment up to 25% is the only allowable supplementation to this award.

The diversity statement is evaluated as an important consideration for this award. Thus, applications lacking a completed diversity form will not be considered for funding. Please Note: the diversity statement is required in order for the application to be considered.



Prompt: please write a research statement in response to the questions below. Be sure to respond to both parts (1.) and (2.) of the prompt.

- 1. What is your chosen area of study? What is your specific research issue of interest? What theoretical frameworks and research methods do you intend to use, and how might the proposed research contribute your discipline? How will your work be useful to scholars outside of your field? How will it benefit a larger community or society as a whole?
- 2. What previous research have you undertaken? If you have not carried out formal research, what activities have prepared you to begin research activities, such as coursework or research programs? Explain how your graduate-level coursework (both completed and planned) are relevant to your research and study plans.

Notes: Faculty from related disciplines, but not those in your graduate program, will review your application, so your essay should be tailored to an educated but non-specialist audience. Avoid field-specific jargon.

Length and formatting: maximum two pages, 12-point font, single-spaced, one-inch margins. Images, charts, graphs, or tables are included in the 2-page limit. You may use up to one additional page for references. Submit a separate PDF of your research statement or attach to this form.

Prompt: please write a research statement in response to the questions below. Be sure to respond to both parts (1.) and (2.) of the prompt.

- 1. What problem does your research address or attempt to resolve? What original contribution to the field of study does your research make? Your response should indicate how your research is original and creative within its context or field and why other researchers in your field would be interested in it.
- 2. What are the primary contributions your work stands to make outside of your field of study, and what potential does your research have to foster cross-fertilization of ideas in similar fields? Your response should indicate how your research advances discovery and understanding and explain the approach you will take to conducting your research. Which members of society—apart from researchers in your field—might benefit from your work?

Notes: Faculty from related disciplines, but not those in your graduate program, will review your application, so your essay should be tailored to an educated but non-specialist audience. Avoid field-specific jargon.
