Redlining UCR

• What is <u>Redlining</u>?

"A discriminatory practice that puts financial and other services out of the reach for residents of certain areas based on race or ethnicity." (investopedia.com)

• Although California has <u>proposed</u> more funding for the UC, recently the Regents of the UC System proposed cutting UCR's budget by 11%.....while other campuses cut 2-3%

• How is UCR being **Redlined** by the UC System?

- UCR and UC Merced have the highest percentages of BIPOC, Pell-Grant recipients, first-generation (50%), and working-class students.
- UCR has highest student-to-faculty ratio and receives less money per student (e.g. UCR \$8,500 vs UCLA \$11,500 per student)
- 1 full-time staff for 5,220 transfer students

• The effects are/will be felt campus wide:

- Fewer work-study and ASE positions for students
- More students per TA/ Professor
- Cutting Academic Programs, Research opportunities, and Athletics
