Micro-institutional Foundations of Capitalism: Sectoral Pathways to Globalization in China, India, and Russia

Drawing on research in China, India, and Russia and examining sectors from textiles to telecommunications, *Micro-institutional Foundations of Capitalism* introduces a new theory of how domestic development impacts integration into the global economy in developing countries. Adopting a historical and comparative approach, the book shows country-level variation in how state elites perceive the strategic value of sectors in response to internal and external pressures. Sectoral structures and institutions further determine the role of the state in market coordination and property rights arrangements. These national configurations of sectoral models are the micro-institutional foundations of capitalism, which mediate globalization and development.
