Do you have an interest in pursuing law school or a legal career? **If yes, UCR offers a Moot Court course.**

What is Moot Court?

Moot Court (POSC 196) is a course offered by the UCR political science department which simulates the next step after trial court proceedings in our legal system – the appeal of a trial court decision.

Why Moot Court?

Moot Court introduces students to legal concepts and practitioners, as well as enhancing their chance of acceptance and ultimate success in law school or post graduate work. Taking this course will also provide students the opportunity to participate in the national Moot Court competition (POSC 196B).

When is it?

Moot Court will be offered **Spring quarter** of 2023.

What are the prerequisites?

You must take **Constitutional Law: The Fundamentals of Freedom** (POSC 167) in Winter quarter of 2023 or have taken **Constitutional Law: Criminal Justice** in Summer of 2022.
