POWER TO THE PARTNER: COLLABORATION, REPRESENTATION, AND INFLUENCE IN AMERICAN LOBBYING

Social, racial, and economic justice organizations provide one of the only consistent sources of representation for historically marginalized communities in the United States. However, they face significant intra- and extraorganizational constraints. I argue that advocacy organizations representing historically marginalized communities strategically build coalitions to further their influence over policy outcomes and to promote more equitable, intersectionally-minded advocacy. I test these claims using a novel dataset of co-signature patterns within public comments submitted by a set of such groups on proposed federal agency rules between 2000 and 2016. I demonstrate that coalition building is a valuable lobbying tool with substantial and pointed consequences for representation and influence in advocacy agenda-setting and the American rulemaking process.
