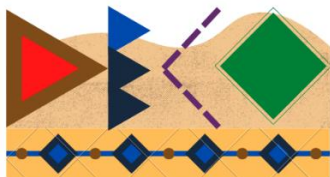


# Call for Papers - Decolonial Praxis Conference @ University of California Riverside



The Decolonial Collective, sponsored by the VOICE initiative, is organizing the 2nd Decolonial Praxis Conference at University of California Riverside. **This 2-day conference (tentatively scheduled for January 19 & 20, 2024)** will serve not only as an academic space, but also as a space for activists, community organizers and academics to discuss decolonial, anti-capitalist and anti-racist theories, pedagogies, research methods and praxis, with a focus on BIPOC communities. **The Conference is FREE.**

We welcome abstracts based on decolonial praxis case studies, comparative studies, ethnography, and participatory action research from scholars, researchers, activists, and advanced graduate students of the disciplines of Political Science, International Relations, Sociology, Anthropology, Philosophy, History, Ethnic studies, Cultural & Intercultural studies, just to mention a few – as well as interdisciplinary studies. We specially encourage Indigenous people and BIPOC in general to participate. **We accept abstracts in Spanish or English. The deadline to send submissions is October 14<sup>th</sup> 2023. Abstracts are welcome in the following topics (but not limited to):

- Indigenous Politics & Indigenous thought (Política Indígena y Pensamiento Indígena)
- Critical & Global South Marxism (Marxismo crítico y del Sur Global)
- Black Politics & Black Thought (Política y pensamiento negros)
- Latinx Politics (Política latina)
- Sociocultural Linguistics (Lingüística sociocultural)
- Migration studies (Estudios de Migraciones)
- Environmental Politics & Justice (Política y Justicia Ambiental)
- Critical Race Theory & studies (Teoría Racial Crítica)
- Feminism & Gender studies (Feminismo & género)
- Critical Labor studies (Estudios laborales críticos)
- Social Movements (Movimientos sociales)
- Critical Disability Studies (Estudios de discapacidad críticos)
- Community & Public Health (Salud pública y comunitaria)
- Violence & Necropolitics (Violencia y necropolítica)
- Decoloniality in STEM (Decolonialidad en STEM)

Abstracts should include, in no more than 400 words, a **brief description of your research/project**, methodology, how decolonial praxis is used/incorporated, some decolonial authors you discuss and the main findings/reflections. It should also include a **brief acknowledgement of your reflexivity and positionality**. We welcome both abstracts of academic and community-based projects. If your project is community-based, you do not have to include parts such as decolonial authors or methodology; just explain the project and how that fits the topic of the conference.

We will have a limited amount of scholarships of **200 US dollars** to cover travel costs for people outside California, we will give priority to students who do not have institutional support and to activists. In the application form you can apply for scholarships. **The deadline to send submissions is October 14<sup>th</sup> 2023.** Please send your abstract through this link: <https://forms.gle/MTFqU3iTWoX7wgAB8>
