What to Expect

Timeline

- Each nomination will be considered for the symposium following the academic term in which it was submitted; thus, nominations for the Summer term of the Academic Year (AY) 2023-24 (23SUM) will be considered for the 2024 Symposium, while nominations for the AY2024-25 (24SUM) will be considered for the 2025 Symposium.
- 2025 Symposium Nomination Deadlines

24SUM: September 10, 2024
24FAL: December 20, 2024
25WIN: March 24, 2025

Primary Instructors:

 Instructors will be *invited* to serve as the discussant for the paper they nominated at the Emerging Scholars Spring Symposium, but there it is not required for nominators to accept this invitation

Nominated Students:

- Have their paper reviewed by two independent reviewers from our Alumni board.
- Be invited to participate in our Spring workshops to help them refine their paper and develop basic presentation skills. If appropriate, we will also encourage them to submit their paper for publication to the <u>Undergraduate Journal of Politics</u> or <u>UCR's The Journal</u>.
- Be *invited* to present at our Emerging Scholars Spring Symposium

Nomination Details (for Graduates and Undergraduates)

- Instructors can nominate or approve the self-nomination of one paper for each course they are the primary instructor for
- Qualified papers can be from any writing assignment that meets all other criteria
- Paper authors must be UCR students enrolled in the course
- Papers must present original ideas, draw on scholarly literature, and contribute to one of the Political Science Department's subfields (listed below)
 - American Politics
 - Comparative Politics
 - International Relations
 - Political Theory
 - Political Mass Behavior
- Nominations are tied to the term for which they were written.

Other Considerations

We always encourage proposals from underrepresented scholars. This includes, but is not limited to, race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, and social class.

We also appreciate a variety of methodological approaches, as we believe in the value of inter/transdisciplinary research.
