Arizona	Proposition 139 (Right to Abortion Initiative) Enables individuals to challenge the state’s 15-week abortion ban via establishing a fundamental right to the procedure prior to viability	Yes: 61.61% (Passed) Result: Expands reproductive/abortion rights
Colorado	Amendment 79 (Right to Abortion and Health Insurance Coverage Initiative): protects a constitutional right to abortion and permits the use of public funds for the procedure.	Yes: 61.97% (Passed) Result: Expands reproductive/abortion rights
Florida	Amendment 4 (Right to Abortion Initiative): Protects right to an abortion up until the point of viability or when necessary to protect the patient’s health.	Yes: 57.17% (Did not pass, 60% majority required) Result: Does not expand reproductive/abortion rights
Maryland	Question 1 (Right to Reproductive Freedom Amendment): Adds article to state constitution’s Declaration of Rights establishing a right to reproductive freedom and the ability to make decisions on one’s own pregnancy.	Yes: 76.06% (Passed) Result: Expands reproductive/abortion rights
Missouri	Amendment 3 (Right to Reproductive Freedom Initiative): Enshrining a fundamental right to reproductive freedom, including abortion and “all matters relating to reproductive health care” to the state constitution.	Yes: 51.60% (Passed) Result: Expands reproductive/abortion rights
Montana	CI-128 (Right to Abortion Initiative): Amended the state constitution to permit an individual the “right to make and carry out decisions about one’s own pregnancy, including the right to abortion.” Also permits state to regulate abortion after viability.	Yes: 57.76% (Passed) Result: Expands reproductive/abortion rights
Nebraska	(1) Initiative 434 (Prohibits Abortion After the First Trimester Amendment): Amends state constitution to prohibit	(1) Yes: 54.94% (Passed)

New York	<p>Proposal 1 (Equal Protection of Law Amendment): People cannot be denied rights based on several characteristics, including “pregnancy, pregnancy outcomes, and reproductive healthcare and autonomy.”</p>	<p>Yes: 62.47% (Passed)</p> <p>Result: Expands reproductive/abortion rights</p>
South Dakota	<p>Amendment G (Right to Abortion Initiative): Enshrines a state constitutional right to using a trimester framework for abortion regulation. First trimester state prohibited from regulating a woman’s choice on abortion. Second trimester the state may regulate abortion in a reasonably related way to the physical health of the pregnant woman. Third trimester the state may regulate and prohibit abortion unless necessary for life and health of the pregnant woman.</p>	<p>Yes: 41.41% (Did not pass)</p> <p>Result: Does not expand reproductive/abortions</p>
