# Safety Tips



## Rain

- Avoid unnecessary trips
- Seek shelter asap
- Get out of areas subject to flooding
- Know where to get sand bags if needed
- Wear appropriate warm, water-resistant clothing

## Flooding

- Do not walk or drive through pooling water: turn around, don't drown
- If water rises, get to high ground or upper floors
- Floods are unpredictable- keep up with local news
- Have an evacuation route planned

## Wind

- Avoid downed power lines
- Take shelter in the interior rooms of a sturdy building
- Secure loose belongings
- Stay away from trees and other structures likely to shed debris
- Stay away from windows
