Intellectual curiosity and imaginative speculation are closely linked. Long before magazines specialized in publishing "scientifiction," there were *Weird Tales* and stories of arcane wonder in the writings of figures we might look to today as the forerunners of horror and dark fantasy. **Craig Laurence Gidney** (@ethereallad) is the author of two novels, *Bereft* and *A Spectral Hue* (a Carl Brandon Society Parallax honoree), the short story collections *Sea, Swallow Me* and *Skin Deep Magic* (both finalists for the Lambda Literary Award), and a novella, *The Nectar of Nightmares*. He is also Creative Liaison for the Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) Caucus of the **International Association for the Fantastic in the Arts**.
