



The Edward A. Dickson Emeritus/a Professorship Lecture Series



"Ancient Maya Agriculture: The Intersection of Archaeology, Soil Science, Ethnobotany and Traditional Ecological Knowledge"

Dr. Scott L. Fedick, UC Riverside Emeritus Professor of Anthropology

Description

The ancient Maya of southeastern Mexico and Central America were one of the most accomplished civilizations of the New World, well known for their architecture, art, astronomy, and writing system. One enduring mystery of the ancient Maya is how they managed to feed very large populations in a tropical

environment with land resources that have long been characterized (by an outsider perspective) as hostile and challenging for agriculture. For decades, it has been suggested that Classic Maya civilization (ca. 250-900 CE) "collapsed" due to environmental degradation resulting from unsustainable agricultural practices, or agricultural collapse due to catastrophic droughts, or some combination of those contributing factors. Scott Fedick's research during his 25 years at UCR, and continuing since his retirement in 2014, has sought to dispel inaccurate and biased perceptions about the environment of the Maya Lowlands, and to uncover the many ways in which the Maya sustainably managed the forest and agricultural production for thousands of years. Fedick's most recent research, funded by the Dickson Emeritus Professorship, has taken him back to Belize, where he conducted his dissertation work in the 1980s. Field research undertaken in 2024 was a collaborative effort involving modern Maya forest farmers, a soils crew from Mexico, and long-term archaeological collaborator Dr. Anabel Ford of UCSB. The team made use of the latest LiDAR remote sensingimagery that has revealed the "bare-earth" terrain and over 2,000 structures within a 20 square kilometer area around the ancient Maya center of El Pilar, on the Belize-Guatemala border. The goal of the research was to model, at a very fine geographic scale, how the ancient Maya organized their pattern of settlement and matched the soil preferences of 31 species of crops now known to have been used by the ancient Maya to the diverse soil resources found in the area. The old notion of ancient Maya agriculture assumed it to be dependent on slash-and-burn cultivation of maize, beans and squash in a uniform and hostile environment. There is a growing appreciation and understanding of Maya ecological knowledge, both ancient and modern, that provided a diverse assortment of indigenous food crops tailored to a "managed mosaic" of land resources and cultivation technologies that successfully sustained large populations.

In recent years, Emeriti Associations at several UC campuses have designated one retired faculty member in each department to function as a liaison between that department and the Emeriti Association. This year, UCR's Emeriti Association is starting a departmental liaison program for the UCR campus. As of September 2024, liaisons with the Emeriti Association have been appointed in seventeen academic departments and two professional schools (Education and Engineering).

The newly appointed liaisons are intended to improve communication between retired and active faculty in multiple ways. For active faculty who are in the process of retiring, emeriti and UCR's Retirement Center can provide access to information and support. For the many emeriti who remain professionally active after retirement, continued interaction with working faculty can be of benefit to both.

Emeriti who act as liaisons can serve their departments by (i) informing faculty members close to retirement about the resources available for successfully completing the process and helping them navigate and access the facilitating support mechanisms; (ii) informing faculty of the activities and benefits of the Emeriti Association: and (iii) facilitating research collaboration between active and retired faculty.

Names and departmental or school affiliations of emeriti who have agreed to serve as liaisons will be posted on the Emeriti Association website. After the liaisons have been functioning for a few months, program coordinator and Emeriti Vice President Jose Wudka will organize an informal meeting at which interested liaisons can share their experiences and learn the best answers to commonly asked questions. If your department does not yet have a liaison and you might be interested in serving as one, contact Jose Wudka at jose.wudka@ucr.edu.

Scholarship Criteria

- 1. Preference will be given to the children and grandchildren and/or close relative of UCR non-Senate staff members and retirees.
- 2. The recipient(s) is a current undergraduate student, who has a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. First year students or transfer students without a UCR GPA should have a cumulative high school or transfer GPA of 3.3 or higher.
- 3. As part of the application process, the UCRRA Scholarship Selection committee is interested in understanding any financial need. Applicants agree to have the UCR Financial Aid Office release their financial aid information to the UCRRA Scholarship Selection Committee.
- 4. At the discretion of the UCRRA, the Financial Aid Office will determine the recipient(s) based on the above criteria and in coordination with the Office of Human Resources.

Emeriti Graduate Student Travel Award Updates By Darleen DeMason

Last spring we had our third competition for the 2023-24 Academic year for travel funding. Ten students submitted requests and the committee, consisting of Dallas Rabenstein, Linda Tomko, Byron Adams and me, reviewed the proposals. Juan Quispe from the Department of Anthropology was our top candidate. He is studying the bioarcheology of the pre-Columbian Tiwanaku people who lived between AD 500-1100. He will set up a biological database and determine migration patterns of this group in the Bolivian Andes. This past summer he visited museums In Tiahuanaco, La Paz, Oruro and Puqui to take data on artifacts, bones, teeth and artificial post cranial modifications. And, in fact, he is studying his own ancestors. He has received \$2,000 from us to help his pay for his research trip.

Emeriti Graduate Student Travel Award Updates Continued

In addition, we found another very worthy Anthropology student; Chi Ha. She is currently in Viet Nam studying how the traditional textiles of the Hmong minority have interested modern eco-fashion designers in Viet Nam and the interactions between the two groups. Chi Ha is interacting with individuals in both groups in three sites in North Vietnam and in Hanoi. Because the Graduate Division provided additional funding for a second student in the Winter competition, we asked if money might be available for a second student in this round. The Graduate Division has graciously agreed to provide \$2,000 for this student as well.

Juan Quispe will be present at the Fall Luncheon on October 4, 2024 to receive his certificate and Chi Ha has supplied a video tape to be presented since she is still in Viet Nam. We are anxious to become personally acquainted with these outstanding students.

Volunteer to Support the FIRST LEGO League Tournaments

Continuing expansion of FIRST LEGO League (FLL) in the Inland Empire has brought a milestone in 2024: two tournaments on the same day. This, in turn, brings a challenge: recruiting enough volunteers to make these events fun and memorable for the children who compete.

In FLL Challenge, teams of children ages 9-12 build robots from Lego bricks and program them to carry out a series of missions. They also prepare a presentation on their engineering design choices, and they study and propose a solution to a need related to the year's theme, which this year is undersea exploration.

The first two tournaments of the season will be on Saturday, November 2, 2024 in Riverside and Perris. Each event will run from approximately 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and volunteers should plan to stay the entire time. No knowledge of robotics or undersea exploration is necessary.

Most volunteers will work as referees, scoring the robot performance, or as judges, reviewing the teams' presentations and their demonstration of FLL Core Values: discovery, innovation, inclusion, impact, teamwork, and fun. Other volunteer roles include timekeeping, scorekeeping, supervising the practice tables, and keeping teams on schedule. All volunteers are trained online beforehand and briefed on the morning of the event, and volunteers work in teams so first-timers are never on their own.

For the first time since the pandemic, UCR will not be the site of a first-round Qualifying Tournament. The QTs on November 2 will be at California Baptist University and the Val Verde Unified School District headquarters. UCR will be the site for the larger Regional Tournament on December 14. Volunteers will be needed for that as well.

FLL has strong youth protection policies, so volunteers must register and be vetted in advance. To begin the process, go to firstinspires.org, create an account, accept the privacy terms, and authorize a background check (at no cost to you). Approval typically takes a couple of days, and then the volunteer can use the "My Dashboard" feature to sign up for events and roles.

UCR has been a supporter of FLL for many years, and California Baptist University has become an enthusiastic partner in the past few years. Val Verde is a relative newcomer, hosting only its second event. Your service can make these events a positive and memorable experience for up-and-coming scientists and engineers in the Inland Empire, and their families. It's a lot of fun, and a day well spent.
