WHO?	Students in grades 4–8 who have autism spectrum disorder (ASD)* in addition to  • adequate decoding skills,  • Not passing state reading test or IEP reading goals.
WHAT?	<ul> <li>Investigate a reading intervention curriculum targeting students with ASD</li> <li>Receive 50 one-on-one tutoring sessions for students from the research staff (30 minutes each, 5 days per week)</li> <li>Receive professional development and intervention materials in the spring</li> </ul>

WHEN?	Fall 2023-Spring 2024; Fall 2024-Spring 2025; Fall 2025-Spring 2026;
WHY?	<ul> <li>Improve reading comprehension outcomes and academic success</li> <li>Contribute to the research base about interventions to improve the academic perfor- mance of students with ASD</li> <li>Increase the motivation and reading interest of students with ASD</li> </ul>
